# **Suggested Teaching Strategies MAKE IT ENGAGING**

## **Practical Scenario Simulation**

You could prepare a scene with a "victim" near a live electrical cord to simulate a hazardous situation. Challenge Pathfinders to assess the danger before taking action.

Debrief: Use the scenario to spark discussion about environmental awareness and risk assessment.

This is just one creative option! Feel free to come up with your own scenarios based on local context, available materials, and the interests of your club members. The goal is to inspire Pathfinders to think critically and act safely.

## **Visual History Connection**

Show images from the **Code of Hammurabi** to illustrate this important Babylonian legal system, alongside depictions of **Phoenician ships**. Both ancient civilizations implemented early forms of **risk management** to safeguard against losses in trade, construction, and daily life.

# **Sound-Based Discovery**

Play audio clips related to the **Industrial Revolution**, such as the sounds of clanking machinery, steam engines, or bustling factory floors.

- You can stream audio directly from platforms like **YouTube** or use royalty-free and Creative Commons licensed clips.
- Challenge the Pathfinders to guess what kind of "revolution" they're hearing. Once revealed, spark a discussion on new risks that emerged during that time (e.g. machinery accidents, worker fatigue) and how safety measures were introduced to manage them.

Important Note: Avoid downloading YouTube content unless the creator gives permission, or the clip is clearly marked for free use. Downloading without authorisation may violate YouTube's Terms of Service or copyright laws. For educational purposes, it's safest to stream directly or use properly licensed audio.

## **Bible Story Challenge**

For the section "Risk Management and the Bible," divide Pathfinders into small groups. Each group will act out a Bible story that illustrates principles of risk management.

Once performed, challenge the other groups to guess the story and identify the risks involved and the solutions or precautions taken.

As you move through each section of the **provided booklet**, be sure to give Pathfinders time to reflect and thoughtfully respond to the questions in the



workbook (also provided). This encourages deeper understanding and helps reinforce the concepts of risk management in a meaningful way.

Focus on this section to help Pathfinders apply concepts to real-life situations such as:

- Online safety
- Meeting new people
- Exploring new places

Encourage responses in the workbook and facilitate group discussion.
